The Paving will be done in two parts—about 2 or 3 weeks apart, to let the first layer of asphalt settle. All of us are paying for the paving in front of our properties, and we want it to last a long time!

PAVING INFORMATION : Recommendations to get the best paving results

- 1. Do NOT run your sprinkler <u>during or</u> <u>after paving for a few days</u> to keep the new paving as dry as possible.
- 2. Keep your car moving as you back out of your driveway. If you stop then turn your wheel, you will create a Dip in the paving. This will not be refilled by the pavers, but could be the beginning of a pot hole for you.
- 3. The paving will be sticky. If it is shiny, stay off the street until it looks dull. The last thing you want is to have to clean asphalt off your driveway!
- 4. If you have a yard crew, tell them NOT to drop the tailgate of their trailers.

If they hit the new paving, it will make a dent. Bill will contact Progressive.

4. The paving will be pliable for 6 months.

When you attend the meeting Tuesday, these can be more fully explained.

DEED RESTRICTIONS

Bill & Stan met with several county officers to clarify FHE and Pasco County Deed Restrictions. The results follow.

<u>Trailers per Code include travel trailers,</u> <u>RV's, Motorized homes, pickup coaches,</u> <u>boats, boat trailers and noncommercial</u> <u>utility trailers.</u>

These vehicles must be stored in the back yard or side yard behind the front line of the home.

If you have your vehicle at your home for use over a weekend or holiday, storage must still be on the side or in back of the yard.

These vehicles may be **temporarily** parked in the front yard for loading, unloading, or cleaning **only.** When this is complete, the vehicle must be moved to the back or side yard. At no time, may the vehicle be stored in the front of your home.

In both our restrictions and county ordinances, you cannot block the side walk. This can block emergency vehicles access and is an inconvenience for other residents, as well as a safety hazard for younger bike riders. County will warn and then issue fines for these violations.

When you walk your dog/dogs, be sure to pick up their waste. It is the responsible thing to do as a pet owner and neighbor. Also, leaving waste on the ground, street, or walk, adds to the pollution of our water.

Progressive Waste Solutions-Regular Garbage Pick-up:

The following items **will not** be picked up by Progressive Waste regular garbage pickup:

- Amount set out **over 6 item-limit**
- Non-regulation container size. Maximum size is 33 gallon or 50 pounds. All cans over 33 gallon must be bagged.
- Brush longer than 4 feet, OR not bundled and tied.
- Trash **not** in bags or cans.
- **Hazardous materials** in trash or garbage. Most common materials: pesticides, paint, pool chemicals.
- Large bulk items such as mattresses

RECYCLING:

Paper can now be recycled with plastic, aluminum, and cans using your designated container.

To recycle all the used batteries take them to our local library on Mile Stretch.

Paper —Newspaper, Boxes , broken down flat, Envelopes, Any clean paper may also be taken to:

- 1. Pasco Schools have recycle bins that earn revenue for the schools. (Nearest to FHE— Sunray Elementary next to Publix on Sunray).
- Other County recycle bins earn revenue for Libraries, parks, and fire stations. (Nearest to FHE South Holiday Library on Mile Stretch, bin located in back of Library.)

If you are unable to take your papers to a Recycle bin, call Millie Olsen 727-943-0939 or 727-389-0033 (leave message) and pick up will be arranged. You can also leave your paper to be recycled on Millie's front porch at 5629 Ivy Lane in FHE or bring it to the meeting.

Note: Plastic grocery bags can be recycled at your grocery store or Wal-Mart.

Recipe of the Month:

Thanks to Cheryl, for this recipe. I have liked Salmon patties since I was a kid, and Quick & Easy Salmon Burgers

Ingredients:

- 1 15 to 16 oz can of pink salmon
- 1 Large egg
- 1/3 cup minced onion
- 1/2 cup Pillsbury Best All Purpose Flour
- 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- Salt and pepper to taste

1 1/2 cup Crisco pure vegetable Oil Tartar sauce, Tomato Slices, Lettuce, 6 Sandwich buns

Preparation Directions:

- 1. Drain salmon, reserving 2 tablespoons liquid. Combine salmon, egg, and onion in medium bowl. Stir in flour. Combine baking powder with reserved liquid. Stir into salmon mixture. Season with salt and pepper.
- 2. Form into 6 patties. Heat oil in shallow Skillet. Fry about 5 minutes or until golden brown. Serve with tartar sauce, tomato slice, and lettuce on a sandwich bun.

Prep to table about 20 minutes. Serves 6.
