Riparian Rights: The term "riparian" is related to properties along rivers and streams. "Littoral" rights refer only to properties along oceans and lakes. However, this distinction is often ignored, so you may see riparian rights used in reference to all bodies of water. Riparian rights can grant waterfront property owners the potential rights, such as, but not limited to: The right to the view of the water; use the water; access the water; Ingress and egress, have a wharf, use of a boat and right to fish.

The FHECA Board is seeking help from our members for someone to take the lead in organizing a committee to review the riparian rights currently owned by the FHECA. Such suggestions might include transferring the FHECA's riparian ownership to the individual property owners who would benefit from these rights. Kicking this project off would require some legwork at the County level. Please contact Brian Thompson if you would care to volunteer.

Interesting tidbit from local news: Should I stay or should I go? It's a question many of us ask ourselves as a hurricane approaches, especially those who live in a flooding evacuation zone. Pasco County Commissioners are weighing their options when it comes to getting more people to leave, safely. One idea — presented by Commissioner Jack Mariano — is shutting off water and electricity in evacuation zone 'A' before a storm approaches. Doing so, he believes, would encourage residents to leave those areas as well as protect first responders going to those areas to perform rescues.
